SNOWED OUT!

A Plan to Make Up a Weather Impacted Offering Weekend



BY MARK BROOKS THE STEWARDSHIP COACH @StewardshipMan Winter is upon us and for those of you in the snow belt that means you need to be prepared for weather to curtail or cancel some of your services! It is not IF it will snow on a weekend but WHEN will that weekend happen? In the south the mere mention of bad weather keeps people at home on a Sunday even if the ice or snow did not happen. As we all know, the fewer people in the chairs the less in the offering plate. So, this manual is dedicated to help you weather inclement weather!

For those of you in Florida file this manual away for fall and hurricane season. Oh, and please don't gloat over your seventy-degree weather while the rest of us freeze!

Do you have a plan to make up for a lost offering? I am amazed at how many churches have cancellation plans for bad weather but have little to no plan when it comes to seeing giving stay steady.

Why is it that we have evangelism plans, discipleship plans, growth plans and mission plans and we don't think about a plan to fund the other plans? Whatever the reason, the failure of good stewardship planning has caused many churches to miss fulfilling the other plans. We always say that the failure to plan is in reality planning to fail.

The number one way in which churches fail to plan is last minute actions. I get phone calls almost weekly from desperate church leaders wanting me to help them with their giving. Since my mother taught me to be nice I avoid saying, "Why have you waited so late!" Instead, let me say it here, "Why are you waiting for a crisis in giving to start thinking about stewardship?"

So, again, it is inevitable that you will experience at least one weekend of poor weather that will impact your attendance. The reality is that when snow falls and your services are cancelled very few of your members will be diligent to make that lost offering up the next time the plate is passed by them. So have this manual handy so we can make up those lost dollars!

Good stewardship results require advance planning!

So, let's plan for that time so we can be ready. I always say, "Get a plan and work your plan." The first step is to take the first step, plan! Here are some thoughts to help you plan.

Key Tools for Bad Weather Weekends

Build the infrastructure now that will allow you to capture a lost offering. You need three basic tools to collect lost dollars when you are unable to pass the plate.

First, you need letters and emails already written and ready that only need editing. Don't worry the Sample section has you covered! I have clients that have hard copies already printed and on the shelf ready to mail at the first sign of bad weather.

Next you need to have printed and ready envelopes that are addressed to your office and contain a postage paid metered stamp. This way you only pay if they send it back. See the sample section! You might think snail mail is old school but it remains the number one means of collecting donations for charities in America. So, let's use what works.

Finally, you need to assure that you have an online giving system set up that is easy to access and use. Online giving is the key to capturing immediately dollars that will help you make up that lost offering. If you don't have online giving check out, <u>http://charisgivingsolutions.com/</u>

Key Steps for Collecting a Lost Offering

Just do it! Remember that phrase? A plan is only good if you work it. One of the first things I recommend is that you keep watch on the weather. A few years ago on a Friday a pastor called me and stated that bad weather was on the way. We immediately went into action. I recommend these steps.

Email blast Strategy – With online giving you can close the gap of that lost offering. I recommend sending out a series of email blasts. We sent out one email Friday afternoon, one on Saturday afternoon and another on Sunday afternoon.

Use the Postal Service – The USPS motto is, "Neither rain, sleet or snow will stop the U.S. Mail." That is true unless you live in the south! So, if you know bad weather is coming mail the letter on Friday or Saturday. If the weather turns ugly on a Sunday mail the letter on Monday. Always have a postage paid self-addressed envelope in every appeal letter!

Raise awareness through your Social Media platforms. Tell the story through Social Media and provide a link to your online giving page. Unless the power is off at their house your members will be spending time on Facebook. So get your offering appeal in front of them! I have given you some samples ideas you can use in the sample section.

A **Pre-Snow Strategy** – The following steps work well when you know ahead of time that weather will impact your services. You might not have to cancel all the services but poor weather will keep many away driving down the amount in your offering baskets. Use this strategy to negate that.

I recommend a three-day blitz utilizing multiple platforms to help increase giving. Take this action as soon as it looks like weather might be a factor for your weekend services.

Friday – Do three things. First, send out a snail mail letter with a postage paid envelope inside asking people to give IF they are unable to make the weekend services. See the sample section.

Next, begin utilizing Social Media posts informing people that IF they cannot attend they can give online and give your online link. See the Social Media sample site below.

Finally, send out an email blast in the afternoon encouraging online gifts. See the samples below.

Saturday – Do two things. Throughout the day post reminders on Social Media about giving online IF members cannot attend a service. Then send another email blast out in the morning encouraging online giving IF members cannot attend.

Sunday – Do the same two things as Saturday but send the email in the afternoon.

A Post Snow Strategy – Sometimes the weatherman is wrong and those rain showers early Sunday morning turn into snow showers. When weather sneaks up on you it is still possible to make up that lost offering by following this strategy.

Sunday morning or Afternoon – Send out an email blast about the services being cancelled and encouraging members to faithfully give online. I would immediately post on all your Social Media platforms messages about the cancelled services with a link to your online giving page.

Monday morning – I would work a USPS mailing out to your members encouraging them to give that week to help make up the lost offering. I always recommend that every snail mail piece have a self-addressed postage paid envelope in it for ease of use.

Mid-Week email blast – I would encourage one more email blast such as those in the sample section to be sent out later in the week. With online giving your members can give at any time so your offering plates are literally taking dollars 24/7!

Social Media posts – I would encourage at least one Social Media post every day for the week following the weather related cancellations.

One key thing, always be positive with your appeals never negative. People don't respond well to guilt or desperation. State the obvious, a lost service means a loss of dollars. Then without reservations ask people to give to keep your missions and ministries flourishing!

These simple actions could keep you from falling a week behind in giving. Don't wait for the snow let's get ahead of it!

Sample Section – The following samples have been tried in multiple churches with great effect. I have regularly helped churches every winter close the gap of what might have been lost due to inclement weather. Each sample is ready to be used with minor edits.

Sample Letter Section – Use the following samples by editing them slightly to meet your needs. The first letter can be used after a snowed out Sunday. The second can be sent out on Friday before the weekend inclement weather hits. Simply edit to fit your needs.

Dear Phillips Family,

The snow fell but so did the power of God upon us this last Sunday! Not only that but the house was full of people eager to worship The Lord. I am continually amazed at the faithfulness of the Phillips family. When other churches shut down the second flakes fly you flock to the house of The Lord! We were truly blessed by the power of God once again!

Still many of our family were unable to brave the snow covered streets and sidewalks to come. The reality is that when our attendance is down so is our offerings. It would not surprise you to know that our financial needs remain the same if not greater when we are faced with inclement weather. Let's not let the snow stop our amazing progress!

Enclosed you will find an envelope for you to give your offering gift with. If you have missed any of our services, I ask you to use this to make up your inability to give. You can drop it in the mail or bring it with you next Sunday.

Would you like to assure that your gift is given no matter if it snows or not? You can set up recurring giving by going to our webpage and hitting the Give button. After you input your information look for the line that says Recurring Giving and check Yes. Set up the amount of your gift, when you want that gift to be withdrawn from your account or debit card and you are set! Then no matter if you are here or not your gift will be! I am so blessed to be your pastor. Our giving has steadily increased year after year allowing us to minister to more and more people and do more and more missions and ministry. Let's not let the weather keep us from continuing to bless the Dayton area and beyond with our gifts.

The following letter can be sent out ahead of a projected storm. Again edit to fit your situation.

Dear Insert Name,

Another snow storm is heading our way this weekend. Due to inclement weather many churches may not have worship service this weekend. Here at Phillips, it is our desire to keep the doors open for worship, however, the snow may make it difficult for you to attend. Even though you may not be able to attend, you can still support this ministry through your offering.

There are two ways to give.

- 1. Visit www.phillipstemple.org/give and use our online giving tool Or -
- 2. Use the postage paid envelope enclosed in this letter

Did you know that you can also set up your offering to automatically be withdrawn from your account to our account? You simply go to our website and check the box that says *Recurring Donation* in the online giving section. Then you never have to worry about remembering to bring your checkbook to church or giving when you are unable to attend.

Help us prove that snow cannot stop the work of God by showing your faithfulness with a gift now.

We appreciate your faithfulness and generosity. Let's pray the weatherman is wrong but just in case why not put your gift in our digital offering plate now? Again the site is, <u>http://OURCHURCH.ORG/GIVE</u>

Thanks for helping us continue to make a difference in OUR TOWN!
